The report provides a snapshot of the composition of our London office, based on a one-time survey conducted in June 2025 in accordance with SRA requirements.


The data presented in the report is based exclusively on responses to that survey collected from the **39% of the individuals** working in our London office who chose to respond and self-identify.



Age










